What is "match quality"?

Match quality: how well an MIS report aligns with MIECHV reporting

Match Quality: High

 Can use the MIS report to accurately estimate program performance on the benchmark

Match Quality: Medium-low/Medium-high

• Can use the report to provide a rough estimate of program performance on the benchmark, but the numbers won't be the same as those on the quarterly MIECHV reports (e.g., different cohorts, time periods, requirements)

Match Quality: Low

 Can use the report to provide additional context for the performance on the quarterly MIECHV reports, but not to accurately estimate performance on the benchmark (i.e., the MIS doesn't calculate the same measure as the MIECHV benchmark or calculates the measure very differently)






