Mom was present for the visit; but Dad was not. Dad was at work. The visit took place a Mom's house where she lives with her 18-month-old son. Mom is currently 7 months pregnant with their daughter.

1. PARENTS' CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES

Mom stated that she remembers looking forward to summer because she went to day camps. She said MGM would also take her on "outings" like to an amusement park. Mom stated that she and Dad have talked about making sure their children have a happy and fun life; and they want to do things together as a family.

M: Mom stated she was raised by MGM. She said MGM left MGF when MGM was pregnant. Mom said she knows MGF and saw him occasionally for birthdays and major events; but stated MGF had another family, so he did not raise her. Mom said she still talks to MGF every now and then for birthdays and such. Mom stated that she has a close relationship with MGM, but that she put MGM through "a lot" growing up. Mom defined "a lot" saying that she skipped class and smoked cigarettes and marijuana in middle school and high school. Mom stated that MGM disciplined her by grounding her but also "spanked or beat" her with "whatever she could grab", whether it be a shoe or belt. Mom stated that this happened throughout her childhood often leaving red marks and soreness, and some bruising. Mom stated that her 3 older brothers were disciplined in the same manner. Mom stated that she was often spanked bare-bottomed and made to take clothes off before spankings. Mom shared that this kind of physical discipline happened more than six times. Mom stated no sexual abuse by MGM or anyone else. Mom stated that she thinks CPS may have been involved with her family when she was younger, but not sure. Mom said when she was in trouble a lot at school for skipping; someone came to the home to work with her family. Mom stated she never ran away overnight, but would leave the house to be with friends, sometimes overnight, and MGM would not know where she was. Mom stated having extended family always around. She said they would have family get togethers where her aunts and her mother's friends, whom she also called "Aunties" would be around. She said they did not babysit her without her mother being there, but they were always around. Mom stated that she was never aware of MGM using drugs, but saw her drink alcohol with friends at the house.

D: Mom stated that Dad was raised mostly by PGM and that PGF was in and out of the house when he was growing up. Mom stated that Dad has two sisters; one who lives out of town and one that lives in town. Mom stated not knowing whether Dad ever ran away overnight while growing up. Mom stated that she thinks Dad was disciplined by being grounded and hit, but Mom did not know details. Mom said that Dad never shared any experience with sexual abuse. Mom said she was unsure if CPS was ever involved with Dad's family. Mom stated that Dad has a good relationship with PGM. Mom stated Dad grew up around drug and alcohol use in the home. She said Dad's house was known as a "party house" and PGF would get drunk almost every night. Mom shared that Dad described PGF as being a "mean" drunk and would often yell and scream at Dad and his sister's and he hit Dad on numerous occasions when he was drunk. Mom stated that Dad told her that PGF would get violent with PGM and that is part of the reason he was not always living with him.

Mom said that she and Dad used to smoke marijuana, and have stopped within the last 1 1/2 to 2 years. Mom said they stopped when they were pregnant with their first child.

M: Mom stated that she used drugs, not alcohol, starting in middle school and through high school several times a month, or even weekly throughout those years. Mom shared that the only drug she used was marijuana. She stated that when she found out she was pregnant she stopped smoking cigarettes and marijuana because she read and heard that it was not going to be good for the baby. Mom shared that sometimes when she is stressed she misses smoking. Mom stated she got caught shoplifting once when in middle school and her mother was called to the mall. Mom said charges were not pressed so she does not have a criminal record. Mom stated it really scared her and she never did that again or had any other run-in with the law. Mom stated she was in counseling after the shoplifting incident because she was depressed but did not feel like she needed to be. Mom stated that she still feels depressed sometimes and it feels hard to get motivated to go to work and do everything around the house, but she shared she feels like she can "handle" it without help.

D: Mom states that Dad does not use alcohol but has been smoking marijuana throughout middle school and high school. Mom has known Dad through high school and stated that they would smoke marijuana together. Mom shared at one point they were smoking every day. Mom stated that Dad has been in trouble with the law throughout his adolescence and most recently for being involved in selling drugs. Mom shared that if Dad gets arrested again he might have to go to jail. Mom states that Dad continues to use on a daily basis and is still involved in selling; and she does not like it, especially with the kids. Mom said she is trying to get him to stop. Mom worries that maybe Dad could use help, but knows he would not go to counseling.

M: Mom stated she babysat cousins a few times growing up. Mom said that she did a lot of reading while she was pregnant with SIB so that she would be ready to parent. She said, “parenting is very different from babysitting!” Mom said no one has ever been concerned with how she cares for children, and has never been involved with CPS. Mom stated that she talked to friends and family and read up on using drugs while pregnant and she knows it is not good for a child being in that environment. She said that is why she quit smoking and does not want her kids growing up around that because she did not see grown-ups using substances around her as a child.

Mom said she has a high school diploma and is attending the community college for criminal justice. Mom stated that she works and has been at her job for about 4 years now. Mom stated that she smoked marijuana because she was stressed and depressed; but quit about 2 years ago, and has not used since then. Mom said she did not think she could get pregnant soon after having SIB, but started prenatal care when 9 weeks pregnant. She said she keeps all her appointments and once Dad came with her. Mom stated that she did experience depression after having SIB, but shared that she "handled" it by herself. Mom shared that she does not like to share her "stuff" with others.

D: Mom states that Dad graduated from high school but is not currently planning on returning to school. Mom says she is pushing him to go back to school and stop his illegal activity. Mom states Dad continues to use drugs, marijuana and has been selling and has been in trouble with the law because of this. She states that he has a close relationship with PGM and sisters and they are lifelines for him, helping with SIB and things they need. Mom says that Dad works for a local bakery and has been at his job for over 2 years. Mom stated that Dad says he won't stop selling because he's worried about having enough money to support his children; especially because he didn't think they would be having another child so soon after SIB. Mom said that Dad has his own transportation and phones.

M: Mom states that a major stressor right now for her is relationship with Dad. She states they argue a lot. When asked what "a lot" is, Mom shared that they argue about something daily. She said that she gets on him for being involved with illegal activity and wants him to quit selling and using drugs. She said that is a major thing keeping them apart and from being together as a family. Mom states although they are together as boyfriend and girlfriend she wants them to eventually be a family together, but he needs to stop what he is doing or she will move on with her dreams and better herself and her children. Mom said she has had housing challenges since she moved out of MGM's house 6 months ago. Mom shared that prior to

her current house she lived in several different apartments, She stated that her first apartment she only stayed for 2 months, as she could not afford the rent, and her second apartment she left after 1 month because she did not like her roommate and the neighborhood. Mom shared that two months ago she moved into her 2-bedroom house hoping that she and Dad could live there together as a family. She said she is concerned because Dad may not be able to live with them because he's not on the lease. Mom shared that if Dad does not move in with her she might not be able to say where she is. Mom states being stressed out with her job because she has been so sick with this pregnancy she has been sick at work or has had to miss work. Mom said she is afraid that she may lose her job and she states that is a stressor on her mind because she needs that paycheck. She said she lives paycheck to paycheck and is not sure how she is going to support all of them. Mom shared that she has friends who get help but she has not really thought about that because this is the first time she is having money challenges.

D: Mom said Dad thinks they have a good relationship, but doesn't like the constant arguing. She states Dad is stressed about trying to provide financially for SIB, and now for a second child on the way. Mom said that Dad lives with his sister but that he doesn't want to stay there as it is too crowded and he does not have his own room. Mom shared that Dad and wouldn't mind moving in with her, but says she's not ready to allow it.

M: Mom states that when they argue they yell, hit and throw things. She said she pushes and shoves Dad. Mom stated that one time, before she was pregnant with SIB, about two years ago, Dad hit her back and pushed her. Mom said she immediately told Dad that he will never touch her again, or she will tell her brothers and they will "take care of it". Mom said her mother taught them all that a man never touches a woman. Mom stated that Dad has never been physical with her since that one time. Mom states getting in "several" physical fights in school with other girls over boys, but doesn't fight anymore.

M: Mom stated that SIB started walking about a year old and expects about the same with the new baby. She said she plans on starting potty training at about 2 years old and may be worried if not potty trained by 3 years old and preschool age. Mom states that SIB has spoiled her by being such a good and easy baby. Mom is not concerned with him being spoiled. Mom said she would call the doctor if baby is colicky or cries a lot and cannot get her to stop after trying comforting the baby. Mom said she would respond to baby if crying by holding, rocking and talking; trying to sooth baby and not let cry. Mom shared that she would not let the baby cry for more than 5 minutes. She said she may call Doctor if cannot calm baby to make sure baby is alright and not sick.

D: Mom stated she is unsure how Dad would respond to milestones and hasn't expressed an interest in acquiring any information about what to expect. Mom stated that Dad "would probably not like it" if the new baby cries a lot/colicky, and she thinks he wouldn't get up with the baby too much; but he would ask his mom or sister for help in this case.

M: Mom said that when MGM would spank or beat her it wasn't effective because it didn't make her stop

what she was doing, but there were times she felt like she was “bad” and deserved it. Mom said that if her kids are misbehaving she might consider using spanking or using physical discipline on her kids. Mom stated that she would not discipline an infant, but make sure he was safe from harm because he doesn’t understand yet. Mom said she would talk to toddler in the grocery store, and if he were still misbehaving she would remove toddler. She said if the toddler continued “acting out” in the store she would give them a “pop” on their behind. Mom said she has tried used removing SIB from the situation like bothering TV or DVD buttons, and giving him something else to do. For an older child, Mom said to keep child from stove and teach him it’s hot; she will talk to him about staying away from it. Mom said that she would put his hand close enough to the flame on the stove to feel heat to teach him what hot means.

Mom stated that she wants to finish community college and get her degree. She said she wants to get a good job to provide for her family. She would like to make things work with her and Dad, but that includes him not being involved in anything illegal and staying out of trouble with the law. She states that if Dad does not change, she can do things by herself and plans to provide for herself and her children. While Dad has expressed no desire to discuss this matter, Mom feels that he may be open to talking about and exploring alternate ways he could earn money to support his family aside from his current means.

FAW RECOMMENDATIONS & NEXT STEPS:

Resources & Referrals – currently using, recommended and/or needing follow up:

Mom is currently receiving WIC. Mom expressed an interest in anger management classes. Although Mom has expressed concern about Dad's illegal behavior, a referral to counseling is not recommended at this time because Dad has not expressed concern or requests counseling. However, Dad may be interested in sitting down with one of the Dads Matter volunteers to talk about the concerns he's having with providing financially for his children, and constant arguing with Mom.

Mom mentioned that Dad might be interested in our father groups. Mom has organized a “mommy’s group” that meets in her home monthly. Though Mom is busy with work and school, she said that she may be interested in our various group activities, as well as working with the program to organize other groups and activities. The parents, especially Dad, might benefit from information about the impact of father involvement on growth and development starting in utero and during the early years of his children’s lives.
