




Benchmark 1: Preterm Birth

Domain: Improvements in maternal, newborn, and child health

- **Definition:** Percent of children (among mothers who enrolled in home visiting prenatally before 37 weeks) who are born preterm following program enrollment (note: lower is better).
- **Cases that meet measure** (Numerator): # of children born who were premature (born before 37 weeks of gestation).
- Total cohort (Denominator): # of children who were born to mothers enrolled prenatally before 37 weeks.







Benchmark 2: Breastfeeding

Domain: Improvements in maternal, newborn, and child health

- **Definition:** Percent of children (among mothers who enrolled in home visiting prenatally) who were breastfed any amount at 6 months of age.
- **Cases that meet measure** (Numerator): # of children aged 6-12 months (and enrolled prenatally) who were breastfed any amount at 6-month follow-up visit.
- Total cohort (Denominator): # of children who are 6-12 months (reached 6 months in the reporting period) and were enrolled prenatally who have had a 6- or 12-month follow-up visit.
- **OVER TOOLS:** Have ongoing conversations with moms about breastfeeding.








Benchmark 3: Depression Screening

Domain: Improvements in maternal, newborn, and child health

- **Definition:** Percent of primary caregivers (PC1s) enrolled in home visiting who are screened for depression using a validated tool (PHQ-9) within 3 months of enrollment (for those not enrolled prenatally) or within 3 months of delivery (for those enrolled prenatally).
- Cases that meet measure (Numerator): For those not enrolled prenatally, # of PC1s enrolled in home visiting who are screened for depression (PHQ-9) within the first 3 months since enrollment; for those enrolled prenatally, # of PC1s screened for depression (PHQ-9) within 3 months of delivery.
- Total cohort (Denominator): For those not enrolled prenatally, # of PC1s enrolled in home visiting for at least 3 months (reached within the reporting period); for those enrolled prenatally, # of PC1s enrolled in home visiting for at least 3 months post delivery (reached within the reporting period).
- **Our Focus:** Do the PHQ9 and record it!






Benchmark 3: Depression Screening

Domain: Improvements in maternal, newborn, and child health



Report Notes | Excludes PC1s who refused all PHQ9s within 6 months of TC's DOB (MIECHV counts these cases); cohort includes cases that have been enrolled in the last 12 months as of the report's selected date (MIECHV cohort: PC1s who reached 3 months post-delivery or post-enrollment during reporting period)







Benchmark 4: Well-Child Visit

Domain: Improvements in maternal, newborn, and child health

- **Definition:** Percent of children enrolled in home visiting who received the last recommended visit based on the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) schedule.
- **Cases that meet measure** (Numerator): # of children enrolled in home visiting (at least 8 days old) who received the last recommended well child visit based on the AAP schedule.
- Total cohort (Denominator): # of children enrolled in home visiting aged 8 days or older at last home visit.
- **The Your Focus:** Have conversations with PC1 about getting well-child visits on time; record them when they happen.





Report Notes | HD5 assesses TCs aged 15-21 months with at least 5 well-baby visits; HD6 assesses TCs aged 27-33 months with at least 2 well-baby visits (MIECHV: TCs 8 days or older at last home visit with last recommended well-baby visit)








Benchmark 5: Postpartum Care

Domain: Improvements in maternal, newborn, and child health

- **Definition:** Percent of mothers enrolled in home visiting prenatally (or within 30 days after delivery) who received a postpartum visit with a healthcare provider within 8 weeks (56 days) of delivery.
- **Cases that meet measure** (Numerator): # of mothers enrolled in home visiting prenatally (or within 30 days after delivery) who received a postpartum visit with a healthcare provider within 8 weeks (56 days) of delivery.
- Total cohort (Denominator): # of mothers who enrolled in home visiting prenatally (or within 30 days after delivery) and remained enrolled for at least 8 weeks (56 days) after delivery (reached in the reporting period).
- **Your Focus:** Have conversations with moms about getting a postpartum visit; record it when it happens.








Benchmark 5: Postpartum Care

Domain: Improvements in maternal, newborn, and child health

Report Notes | Cohort includes all recently enrolled PC1s (non-discharged) with an intake date between three months before the report start date up until the end date of the report (MIECHV cohort: PC1s who reached 56 days post-delivery in reporting period)



Benchmark 6: Tobacco Cessation Referrals

Domain: Improvements in maternal, newborn, and child health

- **Definition:** Percent of primary caregivers (PC1s) who reported using tobacco or cigarettes at enrollment and were referred to tobacco cessation counseling or services within 3 months of enrollment.
- **Cases that meet measure** (Numerator): # of PC1s who reported using tobacco or cigarettes at enrollment and were referred to tobacco cessation counseling or services within 3 months of enrollment.
- Total cohort (Denominator): # of PC1s who reported using tobacco or cigarettes at enrollment and were enrolled for at least 3 months (reached within the reporting period).
- **Your Focus:** Ask about tobacco use at enrollment and make the referral if necessary; record the referral.






Benchmark 6: Tobacco Cessation Referrals

Domain: Improvements in maternal, newborn, and child health

Q MIS Report | Match Quality Count of Service Referrals by Code | Low

Report Notes | Counts the # of smoking cessation referrals (service code: 20) in a given period (category will not appear on report if no corresponding referrals were given in the period), but does not have a denominator of PC1 biomoms who reported this as an issue; has no timeframe (MIECHV cohort: PC1s who have been enrolled for at least 3 months who indicated smoking

was an issue at intake)




Benchmark 6: Tobacco Cessation Referrals

Domain: Improvements in maternal, newborn, and child health

Q MIS Report | Match Quality 6-4.C/D Use of Health and Safety and Safer Sleep Practice | Low

Report Notes | Assesses whether FSS provided information on health and safety practices, including smoking cessation within 1, 2, and 4 months of the first content visit, but doesn't provide information about referrals; requires a discussion about smoking cessation for all PC1 biomoms, not just those who smoke





Benchmark 7: Safe Sleep

Domain: Prevention of child injuries, child abuse, neglect, or maltreatment and reductions of ER visits

- **Definition:** Percent of children enrolled in home visiting that are always placed to sleep on their backs, without bed-sharing or soft bedding.
- **Cases that meet measure** (Numerator): # children (aged less than 1 year) enrolled in home visiting that are always placed to sleep on their backs, without bed-sharing or soft bedding.
- Total cohort (Denominator): # of children enrolled in home visiting who are aged less than 1 year.
- **OVER TOOLS:** Have ongoing discussions with PC1s about safe sleep practices.








Benchmark 8: Child Injury

Domain: Prevention of child injuries, child abuse, neglect, or maltreatment and reductions of ER visits

- **Definition:** Rate of injury-related visits to the Emergency Department (ED) during the reporting period among enrolled children (note: lower is better).
- Cases that meet measure (Numerator): # of parent-reported nonfatal injury-related visits to the ED during the reporting period among children enrolled in home visiting.
- Total cohort (Denominator): # of children enrolled in home visiting.

Domain: Prevention of child injuries, child abuse, neglect, or maltreatment and reductions of ER visits

- **Definition:** Percent of children enrolled in home visiting with at least 1 investigated case of maltreatment following enrollment within the reporting period (note: lower is better).
- Cases that meet measure (Numerator): # of children enrolled in home visiting with at least 1 investigated case of maltreatment following enrollment within the reporting period.
- Total cohort (Denominator): # of children enrolled in home visiting.
- **OVER TOOLS:** HFNY's focus is always to prevent child abuse, neglect, or maltreatment.



Benchmark 14: Intimate Partner Violence Screening

Domain: Reductions in crime or domestic violence

- **Definition:** Percent of primary caregivers (PC1s) enrolled in home visiting who are screened for intimate partner violence (IPV) within 6 months of enrollment using a validated tool (HITS).
- **Cases that meet measure** (Numerator): # of PC1s enrolled in home visiting who are screened for IPV using a validated tool (HITS) within 6 months of enrollment.
- Total cohort (Denominator): # of PC1s enrolled in home visiting for at least 6 months (reached within the reporting period).
- **OVER YOUR FOCUS:** Do the HITS screen and record it!





Benchmark 15: Primary Caregiver Education

Domain: Improvements in family economic self-sufficiency

- **Definition:** Percent of primary caregivers (PC1s) who enrolled in home visiting without a high school degree or equivalent who subsequently enrolled in, maintained continuous enrollment in, or completed high school or equivalent during their participation in home visiting.
- **Cases that meet measure** (Numerator): # of PC1s who enrolled in, maintained continuous enrollment in, or completed a high school degree or equivalent after enrollment in home visiting (and met the conditions specified in the denominator).
- Total cohort (Denominator): # of PC1s without a high school degree or equivalent at enrollment.






